Try and fill in a memory of school that begins with each letter of the alphabet.</p>	<p><b>Future Teacher!</b>            Write a letter to your new teacher. What would you like them to know about you?</p>	<p><b>Giving thanks for our buddies.</b>  <b>Reception Children</b>            Your buddy will be leaving our school and moving on to high school. Think about a way you could show how thankful you are to them, for all the kindness they have shown you. You could make them a card or drawing them a picture.</p>
<p><b>Mindful Colouring</b>            Think about the summer holidays. What are your plans for the summer? What activities do you hope you can do?
